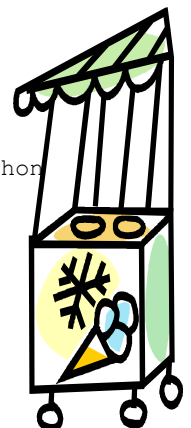

Still Speaking Devotional—"Sing"

Excerpt from Colossians 3:12-17 "...with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God."

There are about 5,400 animal species that make complex, intentional, repeatable, musical vocalizations. That is, there are about 5,400 species that sting. The majority live in the trees, a few live in the oceans, a very few live underground, but there is one-only one-singing species that lives on the ground: us.

Another thing: humans are the only singing species with a precise and shared sense of rhythm, which is what allows us to sing together. Two birds might sing the same song, but they cannot sing it together.

Another thing: if a roomful of people sings at the same time, they start to breathe at the same time as well. Some studies suggest that if the drumbeat or bass line is strong enough, their hearts will begin to beat together, too. And if we're singing together and breathing together and our hearts are beating together, then it's like we're one body. And you know Whose body it is.

Another thing: all the other species stop singing when danger approaches. But humans sing louder the closer the danger gets. We sing together, and we become large, and we do not back down.

So come racism, and "We Shall Overcome" you. Come fear, for "It is Well With My Soul." Come war, for tonight is your "Silent Night." Come death, for "Jesus Christ is Risen Today." Come, all ye faithful, and sing.

Prayer: Lord, I can't read music and I can't carry a tune in a bucket. But I'm-a sing your praises anyway. Amen.

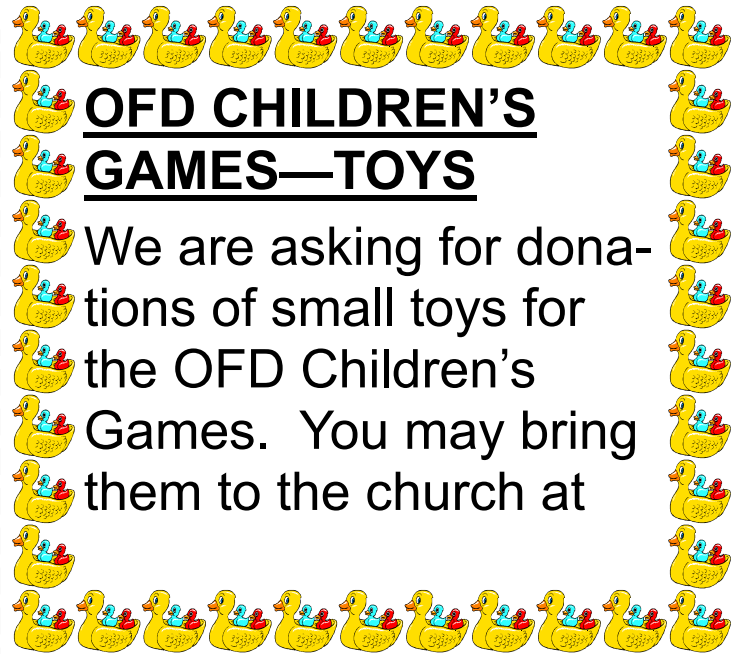

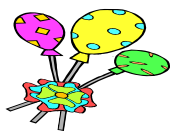
PEDAL TO THE POINT

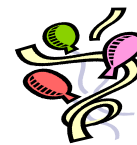

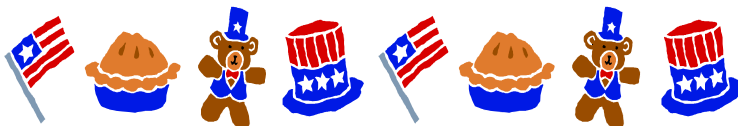

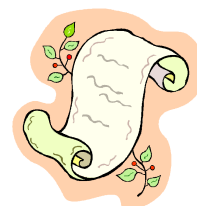

MADISON FOOD CENTER

Thanks for your pledges and support, we are now able to offer information about the hundreds of resources available to Madison residents facing tough economic times. Please share with your parishioners as you can. ~MFC Board of Directors

The Madison Food Center announces a series of presentations to help Madison families access additional services in times of need.

“We are working with Lake County agencies to bring information about their services directly to our clients,” said co-director Chris Van Dusen. “MFC Connections will be held each month and feature a different agency giving a presentation and meeting with our clients who want to know more.”

The first of the “MFC Connections” series will be held on Tuesday June 28th during regular MFC hours of 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. and will feature Carrie Dotson, the executive director of Lifeline, Lake County’s Community Action Agency. Lifeline helps Lake County residents by offering emergency assistance and life skills training to increase self-sufficiency through such programs as the Ohio Benefit Bank, HOME funds rental program, prescription assistance, and HEAP.

MFC Connections is the brainchild of volunteer Mary Shannon who got involved after speaking to Van Dusen about the long term needs of MFC clients. “The Madison Food Center is an ideal venue for clients to learn about the resources and expertise available to Lake County residents,” said Shannon, a recently retired social worker and 34-year resident of Madison.

“So many of our clients qualify for additional types of assistance like help with housing, energy bills, education and training,” said Co-Director Pat Cz-Stafford. “MFC Connections is another way we can help them to help themselves.”

The Madison Food Center provides an emergency supply of food to an average of 275 Madison households per month. This includes around 900 people, more than a third of which are seniors and children.

Located in the Phoenix Professional Center Building at 1954 Hubbard Road, the Madison Food Center provides emergency food to households with incomes ranging from \$399 per week for one person and up to \$953 per week for a family of five. A government-issued photo ID and proof of residency such as a utility bill are required. Clients meeting the USDA income guidelines can receive a 5-day supply for the number of people in the household.

The Center is open Tuesdays from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. and on Fridays from 10:00 a.m. to Noon. The Madison Food Center is located through the back entrance of the Phoenix Professional Center, 1954 Hubbard Road.
